Sulpicio Lines Inc. was founded in 1973 by Go Guioc So (more popularly known as Sulpicio Go), a Chinese merchant who came to the Philippines in 1919, and his sons.

The Cebu City-based shipping company started out with a 16,936-ton fleet of 17 vessels, one tugboat and five barges. It now has a total tonnage of more than 114,000 and has over 2,500 employees. Its operations have branched out to key Philippine cities.

According to the latest documents filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission, Sulpicio Lines is run by Go's second- and third-generation descendants. Enrique Go is president and board chair; Eusebio Go, executive vice president; Carlos Go, executive vice president and chief executive officer; Victoriano Go, senior vice president and secretary; Dominador Go, first vice president; Ricardo Go, first vice president and treasurer, and Edward Go, first vice president.

Other stockholders include Arturo Go, Edgar Go, Edmund Go, Jordan Go, Jonathan Go, Jerome Go, Harold Go, Grant Go and Gilbert Go. Inquirer Research
